Do you enjoy watching football? Some of you may really be into it and others couldn't



care less.

During football games, you will notice that when the offense is

on the field (no matter what team), they will either run the ball to try to score or they will pass the ball. The main player that runs the ball is called a running back. When the quarterback (leader of the offense) calls for the ball, he will step back and hand the ball to the running back. Next, the running back will try to avoid defenders and make his way to the endzone for a touchdown. The running back's primary role is to carry the



Samaritan Thrift Shop

2022 has been a

banner year for the

store. As of December 6th, we have made \$362,257. We recently presented more than \$105,000 to local food banks this year at a luncheon. We made donations to Neighbors Helping Neighbors, The Home of the Brave Foundation, Seaford Community Food Blessing House Ministry Closet, Whaleyville, MD, Bethel Tabernacle Church of God, Love INC, Bay Shore Community Church, The Salvation Army, Samaritan Ministries in Pocomoke City and Cape Henlopen Food Basket. We also put some funds aside for our new building. The Thrift shop will become Samaritan Thrift Store Inc. on January 1, 2023. This will be the time that we will become our own independent 501c3. Although we will continue to be a Mission of St. Matthews by the Sea, we will no longer be under the church.

We are also underway on the design and construction of a new building for the store. It will be located in the same complex, but we will own the site and building rather than renting space. We are purchasing 1.25 acres and will be building a 10,000 square feet structure on the site. The estimated cost is about \$1,200,000 for both land and building. We presently have a little over \$400,000 for this project. We plan to finance the remaining with our present landlord. We will also be meeting with different companies to try to raise funds to offset this cost.

The Thrift Store is always in need of volunteers, so if you have some time and

want to work in a fun location, come by and sign up to be one of the volunteers.

-The UMM sold chili & soup at the UMW Christmas Bazaar on the 11 & 12th. A record of 117 quarts of chili & soup were donated

by the wonderful, generous cooks of SMBTS and Nantucket's Restaurant and Countryside Cafe. We raised \$1,138 from sales which will go to support our budget for missions.

-On November 25th we kicked off our annual support for The Salvation Army Red Kettle Campaign where we "rang the bell" at Hocker's G & E (Salt Pond) to raise funds for those in need in Sussex County. We ring bells from 10am-6pm, Monday-Saturday from Thanksgiving until Christmas Eve.

December: December 3rd was primarily a business meeting where we discussed issues to be voted on at our January 7th Annual meeting. We discussed our budget, drafted changes to our Constitution & By-Laws as well as a proposed slate of officers for 2023. The proposed slate was Gary Ward, President; Dave Edwards, Vice President; Mark Silvestri, Treasurer and the Secretary position is still open. We sang Christmas Carols and concluded our meeting with Communion with Bob Nickle officiating. When the meeting was over, we assisted Bob Nickle with the give-a-way of many of his beautiful prints of paintings he had sold. January: January 7th will be our Annual UMM meeting where we elect officers for 2023. Also, Bob Bennett, from the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, will be our guest speaker (he was rescheduled to January since we cancelled our October 2022 meeting due to several of our officers being exposed to Covid).
